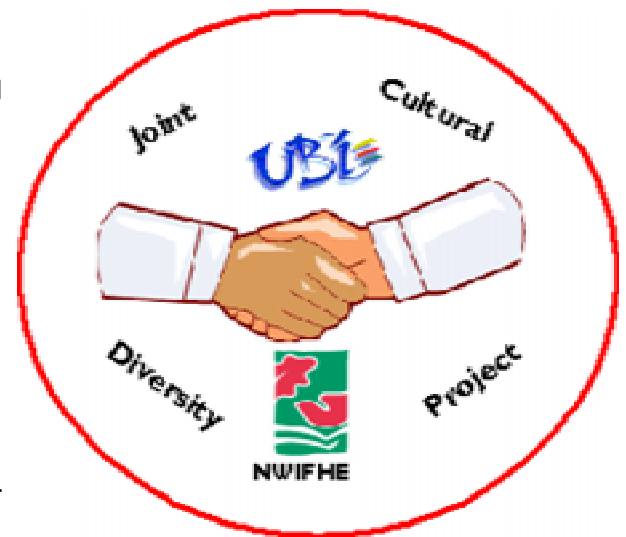

What is this Project About? This project aims to involve students in helping the project outcomes succeed. Students across NWIFHE have been asked to utilize assignments provided to them as part of their course work which introduces cultural diversity to them as part of the outcome.

For instance, some ideas might be:

- Devise a project which produces a product for the Developing World Countries.
- Devise a programme which can be used by cross community.
- Devise a service which can be used by a sector such as community sector. e.g. Waterside Community Centre.
- Devise a website which could be used by the ethnic sector e.g. Chinese Community.
- Develop a mentoring plan which includes integration for the over 60's (retired individuals) with youngsters.
