



Equality

SENDO

The Special Educational Needs and Disability (NI) Order 2005 (SENDO) came into effect on 1st September 2005. The principle behind the further and higher education sections of this legislation is that people with disabilities should have the same opportunities as others wherever possible within education.

Enhanced Access NI Check

Disclosure of Criminal History

NWRC actively promotes equality of opportunity for all and welcomes enrolments from students with criminal convictions. However, in order to manage any risk, you must tell us about any unspent convictions you have. You should do this by declaring on the colleges enrolment form.

Certain courses require you to consider spent as well as unspent criminal convictions. In such instances, you must disclose all past offenses as it may impact on your career progression.

As part of the application procedure a Safeguarding Assessment process is mandatory for all students that have disclosed previous and or pending convictions. The College would like to confirm that engagement in this process does not automatically restrict a student from securing a place within the College.

Applicants that disclose a criminal history will be required to complete a Safeguarding Student Criminal Offence(s) Disclosure Form.

If previous convictions are not disclosed at the point of admission and the College learns or is notified retrospectively this may result in a student being required to leave the course. Depending on the course, there may be occasions whereby a current/previous conviction may preclude a student from engaging on a particular course.



Starting September

Step Up offers a range of new learning and skills courses suited to a range of people

If you are aged between 16-24, not in employment, education or training or over 25 and in education, and thinking about what's next? Consider College Connect + which offers flexible education/employment/training/placement interventions up to Level 3.

DARE (Disability Access Route to Education and Employment) – is a programme of courses which targets young people and adults with SEN to enhance skills and offer experience to create pathways into Further Education and employment.

WRAP (Women Returners Access Programme) – this programme will have flexible duration of delivery depending on the learner needs. Applicants will receive support in getting: refresh skills, build confidence, job coaching, mentorship as well as Higher Education access bursary.

Most courses will be delivered face-to-face and will provide an opportunity to build on existing skills, gain qualifications and to benefit from one-to-one mentorship. Other courses will provide supported work experience, action planning and careers. Courses range from eight weeks to two years, so you can choose what is right for you.

As a part-time learner, you may be eligible to claim financial support* to assist with fees, books, materials, childcare and travel.

The funding available depends on the course you study and your personal circumstances. Some finance options have closing dates - don't miss out on funding for which you may be eligible.

Claimants of Social Security benefits are not normally affected when studying part-time. Some benefits may even qualify for a reduced fee payment (see page 23).

You will be required to pay at least the minimum deposit at the time of enrolment to secure your place on the course, unless you have confirmation that you are eligible for funding.

Further Education (FE) Grant

Available to students studying a Level 1 to Level 3 further education course (8 hours or more per week). This grant can pay up to £465 towards fees, and £265 towards books and materials. ROI students may get assistance with fees only.

How to Apply:

Complete the Part-Time FE Grant form from April. The deadline for applications is 25th October 2024. When you receive the Notification of Award from the Funding Authority please upload a copy to your online account so that a deposit refund may be processed.

Part-Time Tuition Fee Loan / Grant

Available to those studying a Level 4 or Level 5 higher education course. This grant can pay up to £1,230 towards fees and £265 towards books and materials. ROI students may get assistance with fees only and should complete an PTL form. Alternatively you can leave this at the reception at any Campus.

Fees and **Payments**

Fees

Fees for all courses in this guide must be paid at the time of enrolment, or arrangements should be put in place to pay by instalments. The full fee includes tuition, registration and examination fees (where relevant).

Depending on your circumstances you may be entitled to a reduced (concessionary) fee. Reduced fees are applied to the cost of tuition only.

Failure to enrol before the Awarding Body deadline may result in you incurring a late fee.

Please Note: All fees quoted in this course guide are for year one only. Fees for year two and three (if applicable) will be in line with the fees in this course guide, however the College reserves the right to increase fees.

Tuition and Exam/Registration Fees

The tuition fee covers the cost of delivering the course. The exam/registration fee is collected by the College and passed onto the awarding body for your qualification. It covers examination, assessment and certification costs.

Exam/registration fees, if applicable to your course, are payable in full at time of enrolment, unless you qualify for an instalment plan. Please contact the College before you enrol if you have any queries. For itemised costs visit nwrc.ac.uk/courses or call 028 7127 6000.





Material Fees

Some courses may have additional fees for materials, uniform, kit and other items. Your tutor will provide details of these. More information available online.

Resit Fees

You will also be liable for any resit fees. If applicable these will be notified to you by your course tutor and must be paid by the relevant deadline.

Fee Refunds

Course fees are non-refundable except when a course is cancelled by the College due to insufficient enrolments. In this case, students will be entitled to a full refund.

Please note, once registered some Awarding Bodies do not offer refunds. If you have any queries regarding the refund of entry or registration fees please contact our Examinations team exams@nwrc.ac.uk.

Fees Paid By An Employer

If your employer is paying for your course a Certificate of Payment of Fees (Employer to Pay) form must be completed and presented at the time of enrolment. Alternatively employers can sign and stamp the enrolment and exam/registration forms. An invoice will then be issued to your employer for the relevant fees.

Funding for Employers (Skills Focus)*

If you are a business owner or an employee of a company with less than 250 employees you may be able to avail of up to 75% Skills Focus funding.

Instalment Plan

Courses with a total fee in excess of £200 can be paid in instalments. You may pay a deposit and the required balance in instalments as outlined in the table below.

To avail of this you must enrol on a course on or before 4th October 2024. For courses commencing in January / February 2025 you must enrol by 31st January 2025.

Instalments must be set-up via Direct Debit. Payments will be debited on or about the 5th of each month, commencing the month after enrolment.

Further Education (FE) Grant

If you are in receipt of an FE Grant, a copy of your award letter from the Education Authority must be submitted at the time of enrolment. Funding from the Education Authority closes at the end of December.

Unpaid Fees

Failure to pay the required tuition fees may result in one or more of the following:

- You may be withdrawn from your course;
- You may not be able to sit exams for any NWRC course you are enrolled on;
- You may not be able to access any College facilities or our computer network:
- You may not be able to progress to the next year of your course, or enrol on an alternative NWRC course;
- Your name will not be included on any pass or graduation list.

Reduced Fees (Concessionary)

Many of our part-time courses are offered at a 60% discount for selected individuals. Concessions are applied to course tuition only. Excludes examination and other costs included in the overall course fee.

Depending on your personal circumstances you may be eligible for a reduced tuition fee. If you qualify you MUST provide the necessary evidence given opposite at the time of enrolment, (i.e. current letter or proof of date of birth) OR a completed Authorisation Form signed by your local Benefits Office.

Evidence

Evidence provided must be dated within 3 months prior to the date of enrolment.

If you have lost or misplaced your Working Tax Credit TC602 form, you can request a new copy by contacting HM Revenue and Customs helpline on 0345 300 3900 between the hours 8am-8pm, seven days a week.

NOTE: Only the evidence opposite can be accepted in order to be entitled to a reduced tuition fee.

Confused by the education terms and phrases you have come across? If so, use our jargon buster to find out what they mean.

Access Diploma

Level 3 qualification designed for adult learners (aged 19+) to provide opportunities to make a successful return to education. They can enable successful progression onto higher education at university, or directly into employment. Can be completed on a full or part-time basis.

Accredited

A course is accredited if it has been approved by a professional awarding body. If a course is accredited, it shows that it covers everything you need to know for a career in the relevant industry.

Accreditation of Prior Experiential Learning (APEL) APEL is a process through which the learning you have gained from work experience can be counted towards entry onto a course.

Award / Certificate / Diploma

Terms which relate to the size of a qualification which depends on how in-depth the qualification is and the number of units you are required to study.

Diplomas are the largest with the most units. Certificates are in-between and Awards are the smallest with the fewest units to complete. All three types of qualification can be studied at different levels.

Awarding Body

A corporate body with the legal authority to award academic qualifications. 'City and Guilds' would be an example of an Awarding Body.

A financial grant you apply for to help with tuition fees or living costs.

BTEC

A vocational qualification that provides specialist, work-related learning in a range of sectors. BTEC qualifications are equivalent to A-Levels and can lead to further studies, employment and progression to Higher Education.

Careers Education

The delivery of bespoke programmes and interactive workshops that are embedded into the curriculum with the aim of enhancing your transferable skills.

The Careers Academy uses an innovative 3E approach (Employability, Entrepreneurship, Enrichment) to help you reach your full employment potential.

Conditional Offer

An offer of a place on your selected course as long as you meet the entry requirements of the course.

Erasmus+

An internationally funded project which offers students the opportunity to train and study abroad.

Foundation Degree

A Level 5 qualification, which combines college study with work-based learning. After completing a Foundation Degree you can usually progress directly into year two or final year of a Level 6 degree programme at university.

Further Education (FE)

Non-compulsory education taken after school-leaving age. Usually used to describe education between school and higher education (university). This includes GCSEs, A-Levels, Apprenticeships and vocational training.

Graduate

Someone who has successfully completed a Higher Education course (Level 4 or above) and received their qualification.

Graduation

A celebration ceremony for graduates.

Higher Education (HE)

Qualifications at Level 4 - 6. This includes Higher National Certificates (HNCs), Higher National Diplomas (HNDs), Foundation Degrees and Honours Degrees.

Higher Level Apprenticeship (HLA)

A work-based programme, which offers the opportunity to gain quality training and a recognised higher qualification while in paid employment.

Upon completion, you will have gained a Foundation Degree (Level 5) qualification and two or three years of industry experience.

Higher National Certificate (HNC)

A Level 4 qualification that is equivalent to the first year of a degree course. After completing a HNC, you can progress to a Higher National Diploma (HND).

Higher National Diploma (HND)

A Level 5 qualification that is equivalent to the second year of a degree course. HNDs are work-related courses provided by further and higher education colleges. After completing a HND you can progress to University to complete your degree or move into employment.

The International English Language Testing System is a standardised test of English language ability designed for foreign speakers who wish to study and work in an English-speaking environment.

The test covers all four language skills - listening, reading, writing and speaking.

Irish Level Certificate (ILC)

The Leaving Certificate Examinations, commonly referred to as the Leaving Cert, is the final examination in the Irish secondary school system.

Learning Support

The term used to describe the provision of resources, strategies and practices that provide physical and/or mental support intended to enable all students to have an equal opportunity for success at the College. It does this by addressing barriers to and promoting engagement in learning and teaching.

Levels

The Level of a qualification indicates its difficulty. GCSEs at Grade A*-C are Level 2. A-Levels are at Level 3. HNCs are Level 4. HNDs and Foundation Degrees are Level 5 and an Honours Degree is Level 6.

Modules (Units)

Each course is made up of a number of modules (units). Some are compulsory (core), while others are optional.

Non-Accredited

Courses with no connection to an external professional body. They focus on developing your knowledge and skill in a specific area. Non-accredited courses are usually shorter in duration and have no exam.

Prince's Trust

The Prince's Trust Team Programme is a free 12-week personal development and team building course. It enables young people to develop their personal skills through a series of projects and challenges.

Professional Courses

Internationally recognised, professional courses accredited by organisations such as the Accounting Technicians Ireland and the Chartered Institute of Personal Development will support your application for membership of professional bodies and can fast track your career.

Reasonable Adjustments

Action taken by the College to ensure that the playing field is levelled for students with disabilities and/or learning difficulties, where practicable and reasonable.

Safeguarding

The process of taking action to protect children and vulnerable adults from harm. Our dedicated safeguarding team promotes the awareness of safeguarding issues and provides support to students, families and staff.

UCAS

University and Colleges Admissions Services (UCAS) is the organisation through which your applications to universities and most colleges of higher education are processed.

UCAS Tariff Points

A means of allocating points to post GCSE (Level 2) qualifications. It is based on a simple mathematical model, which uses a qualification size and grading scale to generate a total number of points.

Vocational Courses

Work-related qualifications with an emphasis on developing practical skills in your chosen industry. You undertake work related projects and get opportunities for work experience throughout. Vocational courses prepare you for progression to higher education or employment.
