Skills Funding Options

Funding for Businesses

Skills Focus is a Department for the Economy (DfE) funded programme aiming to increase the skills levels, motivation and productivity of the existing workforce by offering industry specific and accredited qualifications at level 2 and above. This programme is open to businesses and social enterprises with fewer than 250 employees.

• Funding for Individuals

Skill Up offers a range of fully-funded accredited courses to provide people across Northern Ireland the opportunity to retrain or reskill to improve their employment prospects. Opportunities are available from entry to postgraduate levels across a range of industries and sectors such as digital, advanced manufacturing & engineering, health & social care, leadership & management and entrepreneurship. The DfE-funded programme aims to respond to the needs of the local economy, helping to upskill and boost productivity in a global market, and all courses are either accredited or industry recognised.

• Funding for Foreign Direct Investment Companies

The DfE-funded Assured Skills programme is a short, demand-led, pre-employment training programme, which is fully funded by the Department for the Economy, to upskill individuals and help them compete for guaranteed job vacancies in new foreign direct investment (FDI) companies and expanding indigenous businesses.



Skills Academies

Skills Academies offer pre-employment training to candidates needing skills for new employment opportunities. These programmes give individuals the skills that employers are looking for in a range of priority areas.

Higher Level Apprenticeships

In addition to traditional apprenticeships, HLAs are a work-based learning programme (1 day in the NWRC, 4 days at the business) enabling participants to earn while they earn and progress the workforce through training and skills development, in qualifications at levels 4 and 5. Businesses can avail of the HLA programme for newly recruited staff, as well as a training opportunity for existing staff, to upskill and progress in the workplace. Example areas are accountancy, software development, engineering, hospitality & tourism and childcare.
